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## HERE AND THERE

### Trophée CCAS Cap d'Agde (October 26 - November 1)

Hikaru Nakamura again proved he is one of the fastest players in the world by winning this extremely strong rapid event in France. The field of sixteen were split into two preliminary round robins, with the top four finishers in each section moving on to the knockout finals. Qualifiers for the knockout were Vassily Ivanchuk, Magnus Carlsen, Teimour Radjabov, Maxime Vachier Lagrave, Bu Xiangzhi, Nakamura, Anatoly Karpov, and Fabiano Caruana; unfortunately none of the women participants, including Women's World Champion Alexandra Kosteniuk, Humpy Koneru, and Hou Yifan, made it to the finals.

The knockout matches consisted of a pair of rapid games, followed in the event of a tie by pairs of blitz games until a winner emerged. Nakamura beat Vachier Lagrave in the quarterfinals and Karpov in the semis the same way, by drawing both rapid games then winning the blitz 2-0. In the final he won the second rapid game against Vassily Ivanchuk to take first prize.

Champion Viswanathan Anand retained his title by defeating challenger Vladimir Kramnik in Bonn, Germany by the score of 6.5-4.5.

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## **WORLD YOUTH CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP**

This year's WYCC took place in Vung Tau, Vietnam from October 19 to 30. Twenty-four Canadians participated, including three from B.C. - Jonah Lee (U8), Chang He Li, and Tanraj Sohal (both U12). The Canadian team had one of its best results ever, placing three players in the top ten in their respective age categories: Kelly Wang (U08 girls), Eric Hansen (U16), and our own Jonah Lee. Jonah's score of 7.5/11 equals the previous two best scores by B.C. players in this competition, achieved by Janak Awatramani last year and Andrew Ho in 1995. Our other participants Chang He Li and Tanraj Sohal also had good results, scoring 6.0 and 6.5 respectively, largely against FIDE-rated competition.

For the first time (as far as I am aware ) the tournament also had a team component, based on the combined scores of a country's best three results in a given section. Canada won a silver medal in the U16 Section, courtesy of Eric Hansen (8.0), Lloyd Mai (6.0), and Alexander Martchenko (5.5) - their total might have been even higher had Hansen not been paired against Martchenko and Mai in the first two rounds. Congratulations to the entire Canadian team who represented us so well!

Estonian WFM Valeriya Gansvind, an occasional resident of these parts, will be playing in the



upcoming chess olympiad in Dresden. She was in Victoria in October, and for training purposes played a series of games against Harry Moore and Roger Patterson, winning both mini-matches by minimal scores (2.5-1.5 and 1.5-0.5 respectively). (In the summer of 1955 Miervaldis "Walter" Jursevskis was due to play in the Canadian Championship, so a training event was arranged to get him in top shape. One of the participants referred to this as the "soup up Walter" tournament; a similar appellation could be used in this case.) Good luck to both Valeriya and Hikaru Nakamura (an occasional Vancouver resident) in the olympiad - unless they play the Canadian teams, of course ...
