DAYKIN, HAROLD CALVERT (February 4, 1925 - August 30, 2009)



It is with sadness that we report the passing of Harold Daykin at age eighty-four. A computer systems analyst by profession and a tournament participant since 1958, it was only in retirement that Harold became one of the preeminent promoters of junior chess in this province. His extensive accomplishments as a promoter included serving as BCCF Junior Coordinator 1987/88 to 1993/94, co-organizing with Ollie LaFreniere the B.C. - WA scholastic match (INTERMAT), now in its eighteen year, and sending tournament reports to local media outlets. Harold was instrumental in the founding of the K-12 Chess Association, the overseer of the annual B.C. Chess Challenge, and also wrote a column in *Counterplay* magazine on junior chess issues ("Skittlebutt") - this in addition to organizing numerous junior tournaments and volunteering as a chess teacher in local schools. It is largely through Harold's efforts and example that B.C. has the junior program it does.

1974 B.C. CHAMPIONSHIP PLAYOFF

As previously reported in these pages (Bulletin 166 and 167) the 1974 B.C. Championship collapsed after five rounds due to a dispute over a forfeited game. Six of the eight players withdrew from the event in protest, which left the remaining Elod Macskasy and Joe Oszvald in the first and second positions. A subsequent Vancouver Closed was won by Jonathan Berry, so it was agreed that Macskasy, Oszvald, and Berry would playoff for the B.C. title. The match-tournament was spread over several months - beginning in late June, the playoff did not end until November. Berry was in poor form, which meant the winner would be one of the two Hungarian expatriates. Their individual battles see-sawed back and to until Oszvald finally held Macskasy to a draw in the last game, thus winning the playoff and becoming B.C. champion. The competition was fierce throughout, with Macskasy's games averaging a shade under sixty moves each.
