34TH WORLD OPEN

The annual World Open, in most years the largest open tournament on the planet, finishes today at the Sheraton City Center Hotel in Philadelphia. It appears a projected \$500,000 prize fund based on 1,800 entries will not be realized, but there are still well over 1,000 players taking part. The event has attracted its usual contingent of strong players, this year including GMs Smirin, Kamsky, Chanda, Moiseenko, Yusupov, Nakamura, Najer, Ibragimov, Ehlvest, Fressinet, Miton, and Milov - all these players are above 2680 USCF! In all some forty-six GMs are entered.

There are also a fair number of Canadians participating including three players from B.C., Bindi Cheng (Open Section, five-day schedule) and Lucas and Noam Davies (U2200 Section, seven-day schedule); Gilles Bruneau of North Vancouver was preregistered in the U1800 Section, but doesn't appear to be playing. After seven rounds (the tournament is a nine-round affair) Bindi has 3 points, while Lucas and Noam have 6/8 and 5.5/8 respectively (both took byes in round 8, and Lucas has had a total of four byes - illness?). To date only one game involving a B.C. player has appeared, Noam's sharp second round draw against U.S. Women's Championship participant Elizabeth Vicary:



DR. ADAM IN SERBIA



of first place.

Just over a year ago we reported on the Easter Third Saturday tournament in Novi Sad, in which Valerian Adam of Prince George came second and achieved an IM norm. Well, the good Doctor must like Serbia, because he recently had three more noteworthy results in the republic. Precise details are not available, but the following was gleaned from the FIDE rating reports:

Borovo-Beternik, International 10-round Swiss, April 24-29: Dr. Adam scored 7.5/10 in the 178 player event, which should have been enough for at least a share

3rd Open Rating Tournament, also in Borovo-Beternik, May 1-5; another 10-round Swiss, this time with 281 participants. Dr. Adam amassed 6.5 points from 9 FIDE-rated opponents, so depending on the result of his other game he had good chances for another high finish.

The third event, the Agronom IM 2006, was a round robin held in Novi Sad May 8-13. This was another in the series of tournaments organized by Serbian GM Sinisa Drazic (last year's Easter Third Saturday tournament was also arranged by Drazic). Dr. Adam tied for third with 6/9, but more importantly as far as I can tell the result should be sufficient for another IM norm, although it would be nice to have confirmation of this.

Between the three tournaments Dr. Adam improved his FIDE rating by 102 points(!) to 2410. One of the requirements for the IM title is to have achieved a rating of 2400 or higher at some point, thus this condition is already met. It should be remembered that we are not discussing some teenage wunderkind here: Dr. Adam is not exactly a spring chicken anymore - to achieve such results so far past his (theoretical) prime is quite remarkable. Congratulations!


KITCHENER CHESS FESTIVAL PREVIEW

WESTERN CANADIAN OPEN 1981

The second leg of the Vancouver International Chess Congress was the Western Canadian Open, held at the Holiday Inn on West Broadway from July 25 to August 1. Despite a low turnout of 74 players, the tournament boasted the participation of one of the strongest players in the world, England's top grandmaster Tony Miles. He did not disappoint, taking first place with an 8-1 score, and was only in trouble against Rob Hawkes in round 4. Clear second and third respectively were Jeff Reeve and Lawrence Day (7.5 and 7). The other grandmaster in the field, former Canadian

Champion (and former Canadian!) Peter Biyiasas did not have a good event, finishing in a four-way tie for fourth with Californian Cliff Baker, Wayne Barclay, and Hee Seid (6.5); the last two split the "A" prize. The "B" prize was also a four-way tie, between Johnson brothers Chris, Tyler, and Damon, and John Chang (5.5); the Johnsons gained 486 rating points between them for their efforts. Raul Serion and Michael Stermer split the "C" prize (4.5), Grant Fraser the "D" (4), and David Moore won the Unrated prize (4.5). Jonathan Berry was the TD, assisted by Ken Morton.
